Announcement of the admission procedure for Bachelor and Master studies taught in English for the academic year 2025/2026 at the Faculty of Agrobiology, Food and Natural Resources of CZU Prague

Part A

Announcement of the admission procedure for bachelor studies taught in English for the academic year 2025/2026 at the Faculty of Agrobiology, Food and Natural Resources

Article 1 Introductory Provisions

(1) In accordance with the Act No. 111/1998 Coll., on Higher Educational Institutions and on Amendments and Supplements to Other Acts (Act on Higher Education) as amended and in accordance with other subsequent internal regulations, the Faculty of Agrobiology, Food and Natural Resources of the CZU in Prague (hereinafter "FAFNR") announces the terms of the admission procedure to Bachelor's Study Programmes taught in English for the academic year 2025/2026. The general conditions for acceptance to study at the CZU and the requirements of admission procedure are set in paragraphs 48 – 51 of the Act on Higher Education, as amended and in accordance with Article 22 and 24 of the Statute of the CZU in Prague.

Article 2

Publication of information on the admission procedure for bachelor's study programmes in English

(1) Information on the admission procedure at FAFNR for individual accredited bachelor's study programmes taught in English is published on the website of FAFNR at https://www.af.czu.cz/en/r-9372-study.

Article 3 **Submission of application to study**

(1) Applications for study in the academic year 2025/2026 are accepted by the FAFNR between 1 September 2024 and 15 December 2024:



- (2) The application for study is submitted by the applicant only in the form of an electronic application via the university information system of CZU. The form is available at https://is.czu.cz/prihlaska. In case of interest in more than one study programme, the application form for each programme is submitted separately.
- (3) A fully completed application form must be submitted in the university information system no later than 15 December 2024.
- (4) Through the address https://is.czu.cz/prihlaska, the applicant receives all communications regarding the admission procedure (e.g. notification of the result or fulfilment of the conditions of the admission procedure; invitation to enrol).
- (5) The fee for the admission procedure is CZK 750 and is payable by 15 December 2024. This fee must be paid separately for each application submitted and cannot be paid in one single payment. Instructions for payment will be displayed after the application form has been created at https://is.czu.cz/prihlaska. The status of the fee payment can also be monitored at the same address. The fee is non-refundable at any stage of the admission procedure.
- (6) Acceptance of the application is conditional upon its proper completion and submission, including payment of the fee for admission procedure.

Article 4 Conditions of admission to bachelor's study programmes in English

- (1) The conditions that must be met for admission to study are as follows:
 - a) Submission of a duly completed application form and payment of the admission fee in accordance with Article 3, paragraph (5).
 - b) Completion of secondary education with a secondary school leaving examination evidenced by an officially certified copy of the secondary school leaving certificate/diploma (or an officially certified copy of a document certifying the equivalence of foreign secondary education, or an evaluation of the foreign education of applicants for study as part of the admission procedure on the basis of Rector's Directive No.2/2021 see https://www.czu.cz/en/r-9188-study/r-9254-recognition-of-foreign-education/r-17071-internal-evaluation-of-foreign-education-within-the-admission-procedure) no later than on the day of enrolment.
 - c) Successful completion of the entrance examination in English language and the fulfilment of criteria described in Article 6.

Article 5

Entrance examination

(1) Set date: between 9 and 15 January 2025



- (2) Alternative date: between 20 and 24 January 2025

 For inclusion in the alternative date, an application must be submitted.
- (3) Form and content of the entrance examination: **an online interview in English** to test the level of English language, motivation to study and knowledge required for the study of the programme.
- (4) The form and content of the entrance examination may be modified by the Dean of FAFNR in case of force majeure (vis major).
- (5) Applicants will receive an invitation to the entrance examination with information about the exact date at the latest by 3 January 2025 via the university information system at https://is.czu.cz/prihlaska.
- (6) An applicant may request an alternative date for the entrance examination if he/she is unable to attend the entrance examination on the set date for serious reasons, in particular health reasons. The request for an alternative date may be submitted either in person at the International Relations Office of FAFNR or by e-mail to the following address: iro@af.czu.cz no later than on the day of the set date of the entrance examination. Requests for an alternative date submitted later will not be considered. Candidates may request an adaptation of the entrance examination due to their disabilities, including specific learning difficulties. In such a case, a written request must be submitted by 15 December 2024 at the latest (in person at the International Relations Office of FAFNR or in writing to the address: International Relations Office of Faculty of Agrobiology, Food and Natural Resources, Czech University of Life Sciences, Kamýcká 129, 165 00, Prague-Suchdol). The application must state the specific requirements for the adaptation of the entrance examination, which must be supported by a medical report or a statement from the relevant professional department. The dean decides on the application. If a medical handicap is claimed subsequently, for example in the context of a review procedure, it cannot be considered in the decision.
- (7) Conduct and evaluation of the entrance examination
 - a) On the day of the entrance examination, the applicant must present a valid official identity card (ID card, passport).
 - b) The duration of the entrance examination is 20-30 minutes.
 - c) The scores of the entrance examination will be as follows: knowledge of the English language (maximum 30 points), motivation to study (maximum 20 points), knowledge and prerequisites for the study of the programme, in particular knowledge of biology and chemistry at secondary school level (50 points).
- (8) The result of the entrance examination will be notified to the candidate within three working days from the date of the examination via the university information system of CZU at https://is.czu.cz/prihlaska.

Article 6 Criteria for evaluating applicants



- (1) The number of admitted applicants is limited by the capacity of individual study programmes.
- (2) The maximum number of applicants who may be admitted to study in the study programme:
 - a) Sustainable Use of Natural Resources is: 60;
 - b) Agriculture and Food is: 75.
- (3) The maximum number of points obtained in the entrance examination is 100. Only applicants who obtain a minimum of 40 points may be admitted to study. Applicants are admitted in order of the number of points obtained until the maximum number of applicants is reached. If there is a situation where there are more than one applicant in last place with the same number of points and the announced number of applicants is exceeded, all such applicants will be admitted.

Article 7

Announcement of the results of the admission procedure

- (1) Date of the meeting of the Main Admissions Committee: 27 January 2025
- (2) Deadline for issuing the decision: 28 January 2025
- (3) Closing date: 30 September 2025.
- (4) The result of the admission procedure (decision on admission or non-admission to study the programme) will be delivered to the applicant no later than 15 February 2025 via the university information system of the CZU in accordance with Article 69a(1) of the Higher Education Act at https://is.czu.cz/prihlaska. The issued decision will be stored in the student's document storage in the university information system of the CZU and will be deemed to have been delivered.
- (5) In the case of a decision on admission, the applicant is entitled to enrol in studies if he/she provides an officially certified copy of his/her secondary school leaving certificate/diploma or an officially certified copy of a document certifying the equivalence of foreign secondary education (or an evaluation of the foreign education of applicants for studies in the admissions procedure on the basis of Rector's Directive No.2/2021 see https://www.czu.cz/en/r-9188-study/r-9254-recognition-of-foreign-education/r-17071-internal-evaluation-of-foreign-education-within-the-admission-procedure), if the secondary school leaving certificate/diploma is issued abroad and unless an international treaty provides otherwise. An exception is made for graduates of Slovak secondary schools who submit only an officially certified copy of their school leaving certificate.

Article 8

Enrolment in the bachelor's study programme taught in English



- (1) Enrolment of newly admitted students in the first year of bachelor's programmes in English shall take place at the end of September 2025.
- (2) Applicants will receive an invitation to enrol in studies via the university information system of the CZU at https://is.czu.cz/prihlaska no later than 31 July 2025. The enrolment date indicated on the invitation is binding for the students.
- (3) For enrolment, candidates shall bring:
 - a) An identity card or passport,
 - b) an officially certified copy of his/her secondary school leaving certificate/diploma or an officially certified copy of a document certifying the equivalence of foreign secondary education (or an evaluation of the foreign education of applicants for studies in the admissions procedure on the basis of Rector's Directive No.2/2021), if the secondary school leaving certificate/diploma is issued abroad and unless an international treaty provides otherwise. An exception is made for graduates of Slovak secondary schools who submit only an officially certified copy of their school leaving certificate.
- (4) At the time of enrolment, the fulfilment of the conditions of admission to study referred to in Section 48(1) of Act No.111/1998 Coll., on universities and on Amendments and Additions to Other Acts (the Universities Act), which is the attainment of secondary education with the secondary school leaving examination, shall be checked.
- (5) If an applicant cannot evidence his/her secondary school leaving certificate/diploma by the deadline for enrolment in the study, and if a graduate of a foreign secondary school (with the exception of Slovakia) cannot prove that his/her education has been nostrified (or that the foreign education of applicants for study has been evaluated as part of the admissions procedure on the basis of Rector's Directive No.2/2021), he/she cannot be enrolled in the study. In such a case, he/she may submit a written request for an alternative enrolment date. We recommend that the request be accompanied by a confirmation from the secondary school stating the reason for the failure to pass the secondary school leaving examination and the date on which it is scheduled to take place. A graduate of a foreign secondary school must submit a confirmation from the Department of Education, Youth and Sports of the relevant Regional Office (or the Prague City Hall) about the ongoing negotiations on the recognition of the equivalence of the document of education obtained abroad with similar education that can be achieved at secondary schools in the Czech Republic, or a confirmation from the Rector's Office about the request for evaluation of foreign education of applicants for study in the admission procedure on the basis of Rector's Directive No. 2/2021 within the framework of the CZU in Prague.
- (6) If the applicant fails to appear for enrolment or fails to excuse himself/herself in writing for serious and acceptable reasons within 5 working days, his/her right to enrol in the study shall expire. The Dean shall decide on the acceptability of the reasons.
- (7) A written request for an alternative date of enrolment may be submitted **no later than 5** working days after the date of enrolment to which the applicant has been invited.

- (8) The alternative date of enrolment in the study will be communicated to the applicant via the university information system of CZU at https://is.czu.cz/prihlaska/?lang=en.
- (9) Only applicants who have duly paid the tuition fee pursuant to Article 9 may be enrolled.

Article 9

Tuition fee

- (1) The **following fees apply** to non-EU students studying bachelor programmes in English:
 - a) Study programme: Sustainable Use of Natural Resources: CZK 42 000,
 - b) Study programme: Agriculture and Food: CZK 57 000.
- (2) Students who are citizens of EU countries are charged CZK 12,500 for studying any bachelor programme in English.
- (3) The fee is stated per academic year and is payable prior to the commencement of studies, but no later than 30 June 2025.
- (4) Refund of the English-taught study fee after enrolment: If an applicant has paid the English-taught study tuition fee, but his/her application for a visa/permit for long-term stay has been rejected or he/she cannot start studies due to force majeure and he/she has already enrolled for studies, the tuition fee may be refunded to the applicant upon his/her request, but only in the amount of the amount credited to the CZU account under the following conditions:
 - a) the applicant's request for a refund of the tuition fee will be delivered to the CZU by 30 September 2025 = the entire tuition fee credited to the account of CZU is refundable,
 - b) the applicant's request for a refund of the tuition fee will be delivered to the CZU by 31 October 2025 = 2/3 of the tuition fee credited to the account of CZU is refundable.



- c) the applicant's request for a refund of the tuition fee will be delivered to the CZU by 30 November 2025 = 1/3 of the tuition fee credited to the account of CZU is refundable.
- d) the applicant's request for a refund of the tuition fee will be delivered to the CZU on 1 December 2025 or later = the tuition fee is non-refundable.
- (5) For the tuition fee to be refunded, the applicant must send application and a scanned copy of the decision not to grant the visa/permit for long-term residence or specify force majeure together with his/her bank details to the International Relations Office of FAFNR. The tuition fee credited to the CZU account will be refunded to the bank account from which tuition fee payment was received. The payment of bank charges associated with the refund of the study fee will be split between the payer (CZU) and the recipient (owner of the bank account from which tuition fee payment was received), with each paying the charges to their own bank.

Article 10 **Transitional and final provisions**

- (1) If the number of applications submitted is lower than the capacity limit of a study programme, the faculty may change the deadline set in the admission procedure announcement for the submission of applications to that study programme to a later date before its expiry. In such a case, the information will be published on the faculty's website https://www.af.czu.cz/en/r-9372-study in the form of an addendum to the admission announcement.
- (2) For the academic year 2025/2026, the Dean of FAFNR may also announce a second and a third round of admissions to bachelor's study programmes in English. In this case, the information will be published on the faculty's website at https://www.af.czu.cz/en/r-9372-study no later than on the day the relevant regulation on the 2nd or 3rd round of the admission procedure comes into force.
- (3) In case when admission to the study could result in a breach of EU sanctions in force at the time of admission due to the provision of direct or indirect technical assistance, which is also considered to be the provision of education in the form of higher education, the Dean of FAPPZ may decide not to admit the applicant, even though he/she has fulfilled the above-mentioned conditions for admission to study.
- (4) This regulation was discussed per rollam by the Academic Senate of the FAPPZ CZU in the term 10 to 17 July 2024 and approved by the Academic Senate of FAPPZ CZU on 17 July 2024.
- (5) This Regulation comes into force and effect on the date of approval by the Academic Senate of FAFNR.

If there is a situation where there are more than one applicant in last place with the same number of points and the announced number of applicants is exceeded, all such applicants will be admitted.

For the date of delivery and notification of the decision in such a case shall be the first day following the day on which the decision is made available in the university information system of CZU to the applicant. In the case of a decision on non-admission to study in the given study programme, the written original of this decision (including the reasons for it and the instruction on the possibility to submit a request for review) will be delivered to the applicant in his/her own hands to the address indicated in the application form in accordance with the provisions of Section 50 of the Higher Education Act.
- (5) In the event of a decision on admission, the applicant is entitled to enrol in the study if he/she provides an officially certified copy of the bachelor's certificate/diploma or an officially certified copy of a document certifying the equivalence of foreign higher education (or an evaluation of the foreign education of applicants for study in the admissions procedure on the basis of Rector's Directive No.2/2021 see https://www.czu.cz/en/r-9188-study/r-9254-recognition-of-foreign-education/r-17071-internal-evaluation-of-foreign-education-within-the-admission-procedure), if the bachelor's diploma is issued abroad and unless an international treaty provides otherwise. An exception is made for graduates of Slovak universities who submit only an officially certified copy of their bachelor's degree.

Article 8

Enrolment in the master's study programme taught in English

(1) Enrolment of newly admitted students in the first year of master's programmes in English shall take place at the end of September 2025.



- (2) Applicants will receive an invitation to enrol in studies via the university information system of the CZU at https://is.czu.cz/prihlaska no later than 31 July 2025. The enrolment date indicated on the invitation is binding for the students.
- (3) For enrolment, candidates shall bring:
 - c) An identity card or passport,
 - d) an officially certified copy of his/her bachelor's certificate/diploma or an officially certified copy of a document certifying the equivalence of foreign higher education (or an evaluation of the foreign education of applicants for studies in the admissions procedure on the basis of Rector's Directive No.2/2021), if the bachelor's certificate/diploma is issued abroad and unless an international treaty provides otherwise. An exception is made for graduates of Slovak Universities who submit only an officially certified copy of their Bachelor's diploma.
- (4) At the time of enrolment, the fulfilment of the condition of admission to study referred to in Section 48(1) of Act No.111/1998 Coll., on universities and on Amendments and Additions to Other Acts (the Universities Act), which is the attainment of bachelor's degree, shall be checked.
- (5) If an applicant cannot prove his/her bachelor's degree by the deadline for enrolment in the study, and if a graduate of a foreign university (except Slovakia) cannot prove his/her education nostrification (or the evaluation of the foreign education of applicants for study in the admission procedure on the basis of Rector's Directive No.2/2021), he/she cannot be enrolled in the study. In such a case, he/she may submit a written request for an alternative enrolment date. The request must be accompanied by a certificate issued by the university's study department stating the reason why proof of successful completion of the bachelor's degree has not yet been issued, or a certificate stating the date on which the state final examination is scheduled to take place. A graduate of a foreign university must submit a confirmation from one of the universities accredited by the Ministry of Education, Youth and Sports of the Czech Republic on the ongoing negotiations on the recognition of the equivalence of the document of education obtained abroad with a similar education that can be obtained at universities in the Czech Republic, or a confirmation from the Rector's Department on the request for evaluation of foreign education of applicants for study within the admission procedure on the basis of Rector's Directive No. 2/2021 within the CZU in Prague.
- (6) If the applicant fails to appear for enrolment or fails to excuse himself/herself in writing for serious and acceptable reasons within 5 working days, his/her right to enrol in the study shall expire. The Dean shall decide on the acceptability of the reasons.
- (7) A written request for an alternative date of enrolment may be submitted no later than 5 working days after the date of enrolment to which the applicant has been invited.

- (2) The study of all master's programmes in English is for students, who are citizens of EU countries are charged a fee of CZK 12,500.
- (3) The fee is stated per academic year and is payable prior to the commencement of studies, but no later than 30 June 2025.
- (4) Refund of the English-taught study fee after enrolment: If an applicant has paid the English-taught study tuition fee, but his/her application for a visa/permit for long-term stay has been rejected and he/she has already enrolled for studies, the tuition fee may be refunded to the applicant upon his/her request, but only in the amount of the amount credited to the CZU account under the following conditions:
 - a) the applicant's request for a refund of the tuition fee will be delivered to the CZU by 30 September 2025 = the entire tuition fee credited to the account of CZU is refundable,
 - b) the applicant's request for a refund of the tuition fee will be delivered to the CZU by 31 October 2025 = 2/3 of the tuition fee credited to the account of CZU is refundable.
 - c) the applicant's request for a refund of the tuition fee will be delivered to the CZU by 30 November 2025 = 1/3 of the tuition fee credited to the account of CZU is refundable,
 - d) the applicant's request for a refund of the tuition fee will be delivered to the CZU on 1 December 2025 or later = the tuition fee is non-refundable.
- (5) For the tuition fee to be refunded, the applicant must send application and a scanned copy of the decision not to grant the visa/permit for long-term residence or specify force majeure together with his/her bank details to the International Relations Office of FAFNR.



The study fee credited to the CZU account will be refunded to the bank account from which tuition fee payment was received. The payment of bank charges associated with the refund of the study fee will be split between the payer (CZU) and the recipient (owner of the bank account from which tuition fee payment was received), with each paying the charges to their own bank.

Article 10 **Transitional and final provisions**

- (1) If the number of applications submitted is lower than the capacity limit of a study programme, the faculty may change the deadline set in the admission procedure announcement for the submission of applications to that study programme to a later date before its expiry. In such a case, the information will be published on the faculty's website https://www.af.czu.cz/en/r-9372-study in the form of an addendum to the admission announcement.
- (2) For the academic year 2025/2026, the Dean of FAFNR may also announce a second and a third round of admissions to master's study programmes in English. In this case, the information will be published on the faculty's website at https://www.af.czu.cz/en/r-9372-study no later than on the day the relevant regulation on the 2nd or 3rd round of the admission procedure comes into force.
- (3) In case when admission to the study could result in a breach of EU sanctions in force at the time of admission due to the provision of direct or indirect technical assistance, which is also considered to be the provision of education in the form of higher education, the Dean of FAPPZ may decide not to admit the applicant, even though he/she has fulfilled the above-mentioned conditions for admission to study.
- (4) This Regulation does not apply to the admission of students to the following joint degree or double degree master's study programmes that FAPPZ is implementing in cooperation with foreign partner universities on the basis of the following cooperation agreements:
 - a) Joint degree programme: Natural Resources Management and Ecological Engineering partner university: University of Natural Resources and Life Sciences in Vienna, Austria; cooperation agreement concluded on 23 January 2019;
 - b) **joint degree study programme: Danube AgriFood Master** partner universities: Hungarian University of Agriculture and Life Sciences, Hungary, University of Natural Resources and Life Sciences, Vienna, Austria; University of Zagreb, Croatia; University of Novi Sad, Faculty of Agriculture, Serbia; Slovak University of Agriculture in Nitra, Slovakia and University of Life Sciences "King Michael I" from Timisoara", Romania; cooperation agreement concluded on 3 May 2022;
 - c) double degree programme: Sustainable Agriculture and Food Security partner university: University of Pisa, Italy; cooperation agreement concluded on 30 September 2020.



The admission of students to these programmes, including tuition fees, is governed by the above-mentioned cooperation agreements with the respective foreign universities.

- (5) This regulation was discussed per rollam by the Academic Senate of the FAPPZ ČZU in the term 10 to 17 July 2024 and approved by the Academic Senate of FAPPZ ČZU on 17 July 2024.
- (6) This Regulation comes into force and effect on the date of approval by the Academic Senate of FAFNR.
